SCT Conduct Policy

Approved November 19, 2019 by the SCT Board of Directors

The Society for Clinical Trials (SCT) is committed to providing an atmosphere in which personal respect and intellectual growth are valued and the free expression and exchange of ideas are encouraged. Consistent with this commitment, it is the policy of the SCT that all participants in SCT activities enjoy a welcoming environment free from unlawful discrimination, harassment, and retaliation. We strive to be a community that welcomes and supports people of all backgrounds and identities. This includes, but is not limited to, members of any race, ethnicity, culture, national origin, color, immigration status, social and economic class, educational level, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, age, size, family status, political belief, religion, and mental and physical ability.

All participants—including, but not limited to, attendees, students, registered guests, staff, contractors, and exhibitors—at the SCT Annual Meeting or other SCT activities, including participation on committees—whether official or unofficial—agree to comply with all rules and conditions of the activities. Your participation in SCT activities, registration for or attendance at the SCT Annual Meeting indicates your agreement to abide by this policy and its terms.

Expected Behavior

- Model and support the norms of professional respect necessary to promote the conditions for healthy exchange of scientific ideas.
- Speak and conduct yourself professionally; do not insult or disparage other participants.
- Be conscious of hierarchical structures in the SCT community, specifically the existence of stark power differentials between junior and senior professionals - noting that fear of retaliation from senior professionals can make it difficult for junior professionals to express discomfort, rebuff unwelcome advances, and report violations of the conduct policy.
- Be sensitive to body language and other non-verbal signals and respond respectfully.

Unacceptable Behavior

- Violent threats or language directed against another person
- Discriminatory jokes and language
- Inclusion of unnecessary sexually explicit, violent, or otherwise sensitive materials in presentations
- Posting (or threatening to post), without permission, other people's personally identifying information online, including on social networking sites
- Personal insults including, but not limited to, those using racist, sexist, homophobic, or xenophobic terms
- Unwelcome solicitation of emotional or physical intimacy such as sexual advances; propositions; sexual flirtations; sexually-related touching; and graphic gestures or comments about sex or another person's dress, body, or sexual activities
- Advocating for, encouraging, or dismissing the severity of any of the above behaviors.

Consequences of Unacceptable Behavior

At the SCT's sole discretion, unacceptable behavior may result in removal from or denial of access to the Annual Meeting facilities or activities, without refund of any applicable registration fees or costs. In addition, the SCT reserves the right to report violations to an individual's employer or institution or to a law-enforcement agency. Those engaging in unacceptable behavior may also be banned from future SCT activities or face additional penalties.

What to Do if You Witness or Are Subject to Unacceptable Behavior

If you are being harassed, notice that someone else is being harassed, or have any other concerns relating to harassment, please contact the SCT Executive Director. If you witness potential harm to a conference participant, be proactive in helping to mitigate or avoid that harm; if you see or hear something that concerns you, please say something. The SCT Board will review all reports and make determination regarding whether an infraction has occurred, as well as the process for managing infractions on a case-by-case basis.

Assumption of Risk and Waiver of Claims for In-person Attendees

The 2024 SCT Annual Meeting (“Annual Meeting”) will be held May 19 – 22, 2024, at the Boston Marriott Copley Place Hotel (a “Venue”). In consideration of being permitted by SCT to participate in the Annual Meeting and in recognition of SCT’s reliance thereon, the individual named below (referred to as “I”, “me”, or “Attendee”) agrees to all the terms and conditions stated in this Assumption of Risk and Waiver of Claims (“Waiver”).

I acknowledge that attending the Annual Meeting carries risk due to the contagious nature of the COVID-19 virus and the fact that the Annual Meeting will be held indoors with a large number of attendees. I acknowledge that exposure or infection to COVID-19 may result in illness, personal injury, psychological injury, pain, suffering, temporary or permanent disability, death, and/or financial loss. I understand that SCT cannot guarantee that I will not become infected with COVID-19 or other infectious diseases in connection with the Annual Meeting. I made the decision to attend the Annual Meeting in person with a full understanding of the inherent risks of such decision and agree as follows:

I am attending the Annual Meeting voluntarily, and at my own risk. I understand that by attending, I risk being exposed to and/or infected with COVID-19, or other diseases, as a result of my actions or those of other attendees or participants, including, without limitation, SCT’s officers, directors, members, staff, agents, and representatives (collectively, “SCT Parties”) and the Venues’ employees and agents. I hereby release, for myself, my heirs, and my personal representatives, and do forever discharge SCT, SCT Parties, and the Venues from any and all claims, liabilities, actions, damages, costs or expenses of any kind arising out of, in connection with, or relating to my attending or participating in the Annual Meeting, including, without limitation, any illness, damages, or injury resulting from my travel to and from, and attendance at, the Annual Meeting, participation in events related to the Annual Meeting, exposure to an infectious disease (including COVID-19), or the manner in which the Annual Meeting or its related events and activities are conducted (collectively, “Claim”), whether a condition giving rise to any Claim occurred before, during, or after I attended or participated in the Annual Meeting.

I will follow all required health and safety guidelines, protocols, policies, regulations, and mandates relating to my attendance at the Annual Meeting, including, but not limited to, Centers for Disease Control guidelines, statutes, regulations, and other mandates applicable to the locale of the Annual Meeting, as well as any additional requirements imposed by SCT or the Venues.

I will monitor my own health status and will not attend the Annual Meeting if I am symptomatic of COVID-19 in any way, or if I believe I was exposed to someone with COVID-19.

I understand I will not be allowed to attend the Annual Meeting unless I agree to be bound by the terms and conditions of this Waiver and that my failure to comply with required safety protocols or follow the direction of SCT staff or Venue staff on site may result in the loss of my right to attend or participate in the Annual Meeting, including forfeiture of any registration fees paid.

This Waiver constitutes the entire agreement of SCT and me with respect to the subject matter contained in this Waiver and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous understandings, agreements, representations, and warranties, both written and oral, with respect to such subject matter. If any term or provision of this Waiver is invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other term or provision of this Waiver or invalidate or render unenforceable such term or provision in any other jurisdiction. This Waiver is binding on and shall inure to the benefit of SCT and me and our respective successors and assigns. All matters arising out of or relating to this Waiver shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the internal laws of the State of Illinois without giving effect to any choice or conflict of law provision or rule (whether of the State of Illinois or any other jurisdiction). Any claim or cause of action arising under this Waiver may be brought only in the federal and state courts located in Cook County, Illinois and I hereby consent to the exclusive jurisdiction of such courts.
