Patient Reported Outcomes

 Patient-reported outcomes (PRO) are measures of a subjects' health status provided directly by the subject without intervention or interpretation by a health care professional.

 PROs are often used in the clinical trials for evaluating endpoints to detect the subject's perception of the effectiveness of a drug or device.

Patient Reported Outcomes

 The use of PROs by regulatory authorities is being encouraged as a methodology that provides structured techniques and instruments that minimizes measurement error and ensures consistency in data collection and analysis.

 PROs that have been rigorously developed and validated often provide an unbiased assessment of the safety and efficacy of planned treatment modalities.
